

GOLF

1. The Greens Committee, which reports to the BOG, is responsible for advising the Management Company or General Manager of member's concerns regarding the golf course grounds. Member's comments and suggestions should be directed to this committee.
2. The Golf Committee, which reports to the BOG, is responsible for the play on the course. They issue rules for play, etiquette and conduct on the course. Member's comments and suggestions should be directed to this committee. The Golf Professional and his staff are charged with enforcing these rules.
3. All players must register in the Pro Shop prior to play. The registration slip must be presented to the starter. Twosomes or groups of five or more may play only with the authorization of the golf professional. Single players may not make a starting time. Singles and twosomes will be grouped with other players at the discretion of the golf professional or starter.
4. Residents of Spruce Creek Fly-In who are not members of Spruce Creek Country Club shall be restricted to no more than one round of golf per month at the Club and only if accompanied by a member.
5. The use of a golf cart is required for all play. Equity golf members may walk after 2:00 PM with the permission of the golf professional. (Sponsored high school, collegiate or professional tournaments may be exceptions).
6. Golf members may make tee time reservations up to fourteen (14) days in advance. All other members and outside guests may make reservations seven (7) days in advance. The number of players must be indicated.
7. The General Manager and Golf Professional are responsible for scheduling and conduct of all Club events as well as outside (non-member, non-club sponsored) events in accordance with rules established by the Golf Committee.
8. Eligibility to participate in major club events (e.g. member-guest, member-member, etc) is limited to members in good standing. All member accounts must be current before a member is permitted to participate. Entry fee must be paid in advance for the Member-Guest.
9. Dress Code:
 - Collared shirts are required. No tank tops, fishnet tops, T-shirts, cut-offs, sweat pants, blue jeans, bathing suits or tennis shorts are permitted.
 - Ladies are required to wear appropriate and acceptable golf attire. No halter-tops, tank tops, tee shirts, bathing suits, sweat pants, blue jeans, tennis dresses or cut-offs are permitted.
 - The Pro Shop shall deny golfing privileges to anyone not in conformance with this code.

10. Only Golf category members of the Club will be entitled to:
 - Priority participation in all official Club golf events.
 - Membership in Club golf associations (e.g. MGA, WGA, WGA Niners)
 - Participation in Club sanctioned events, e.g. Member-Guest, Member-Member, Ryder Cup, weekly MGA and WGA tournaments, Monday/Friday men's morning shotgun.
 - Tournaments have been identified as "open" or "closed". Charity events are open to all SCCC members, Spruce Creek Fly – In residents, and individuals outside the community. Members may invite a guest for the "fun" event tournaments, i.e. Labor Day, Turkey Shoot, Toys for Tots, Night Golf, Snow Bird Farewell, Memorial Day, and Fourth of July. The guest may play in only one of these tournaments throughout the golf year (September 1st through August 31st). Visiting out of town house guests of golf members may play in these events, provided they have an established handicap. A guest is anyone who is not a SCCC golf member. Other events fall under eligibility requirements of the association involved, i.e. MGA, WGA, 9 Holvers, and Monday/Friday players. The Pro and his staff will monitor and enforce these policies.

11. All play shall be governed by USGA rules and/or printed local rules.

12. Practice Area:
 - The practice area includes the driving range, putting green, practice sand bunker and practice pitching green.
 - Range balls must be purchased from the Pro Shop.
 - No range balls are permitted on the putting green.
 - Range balls may not be used on the golf course or taken home.
 - Golf course dress code is applicable.

13. Handicaps:
 - The Handicap Committee shall provide "peer" review and authority over all members' handicaps.
 - Handicaps are computed under the supervision of the club professional in accordance with the current USGA Handicap System.
 - Each member is responsible for turning in a score for each round played. All golf scorecards, for the purpose of handicapping, should be placed in the box provided in the Pro Shop. Each player's handicap number (Membership Number) must be on the scorecard beside his or her full name. Also, if other than red (ladies) or white (mens) tees are used, this should be indicated.
 - Accurate records are kept by the Club's Professional Staff of scores turned in and recorded for full rounds played. The Handicap Committee will determine if there are violations by members in turning in their scores. If there are violations, the Handicap Committee will assign a round of seventy two (72) and shall continue to do so as long as these violations occur.

14. Members/Guests without a USGA or other recognized Handicap or who have not recorded 10 scores in the preceding 12 months may enter tournaments, but will be ineligible for any prize recognition.

15. The starter and course rangers have a job description, which includes treating all members with respect. Should they make a request of your group, please follow their request without dissent. Should you disagree, please advise the Golf Professional who has full authority to handle.
16. Golf Carts - General
- Golf carts should not be driven closer than 30 yards from any green. Handicap flag holders have a 30-foot restriction.
 - Handicap flags may be provided at the discretion of the golf professional. Members desiring a handicap flag must annually submit a signed doctor's Medical Certificate documenting walking restrictions. The golf professional shall keep a file of registered handicap flag holders and may cancel the privilege if abused.
 - No more than two people and two bags per cart are permitted. Only two carts per foursome (one cart per twosome) are allowed unless authorized by the golf professional.
17. Golf Cart - Private
- Private golf carts are required to be electric, white or cream color and subject to safety inspection by the Professional staff.
 - Members desiring private golf cart privileges must complete a Cart Registration Form. Each registered cart will be assigned a registration number and a current Trail Fee Sticker, after approval by the Club's Professional Staff as complying with appearance, safety equipment, and other standards set forth herein. The sticker will be displayed on the left front of the golf cart.
 - Private golf carts not displaying the correct number and sticker will not be authorized for use on the golf course property at any time.
 - An annual Trail Fee for privately owned golf carts is determined by the BOG. Each owner of a privately owned golf cart who desires private golf cart privileges at the Club shall pay the Annual Trail Fee. This fee, like dues, is considered a commitment for the annual amount.
 - The Trail Fee includes use of a privately owned golf cart only by members who have private golf cart privileges. No subletting of privately owned golf carts is allowed. All other persons riding in a privately owned golf cart shall be required to pay the daily golf cart fee. Spouses of members with private golf cart privileges shall be provided a Club cart, if such member and spouse are playing simultaneously.
 - Privately owned golf carts may be taken on the course by Trail Fee paying members only.
 - All private golf cart owners shall be required to sign a release of liability agreeing to hold the Club and its operator harmless as a result of any loss or damage relating to owner's operation of the golf cart.
 - Each year a member owning a private golf cart shall be required to provide the Club with proof that the operation of their golf cart is covered by a liability insurance policy of the member with policy limits at least equal to \$100,000 personal injury coverage per person, \$300,000 personal injury coverage per occurrence and \$100,000 property damage coverage.

- Private golf cart owners are required to register at the Pro Shop prior to commencing play.
- Members using a private golf cart will be held fully responsible for any and all damages caused by the misuse of the golf cart by such members or their guests, and the members shall reimburse the Club for any and all damages the Club may sustain by reason of such misuse, including without limitation, damage to other golf carts and any property of the Club.

18. Golf Carts – Club Owned

- Club owned carts may not be used by a club member or guest without proper assignment and registration in the Golf Shop.
- Operators must be at least sixteen (16) years of age and have a valid automobile driver's license.
- Club owned carts are not permitted off golf course property.
- Obey all Cart Control Traffic Signs. Automobiles have the right of way.
- Operation of Club owned carts is a risk of the operator. The cost of repair to a golf cart damaged as a result of a member or their guest will be charged to the member.
